Conditions were very dry. Most of these were found in the gullies.

*Artomyces pyxidatus* – Crown Coral; formerly *Clavicornia pyxidata*

*Cantharellus cibarius* – Yelly Chanterelle

*Coprinopsis variegata* – Previously named *Coprinus quadrifidus* – Shingle Cap Inky

*Cortinarius distans* – Widely spaced gills

*Ductifera pululahuana* – White Jelly (named for site in Ecuador); formerly *Exidia alba*

*Fomes fomentarius* – Tinder Polypore

*Fuligo septica* – Dog Vomit Slime Mold

*Ganoderma applanatum* – Artist's Conk

*Hymenopellis megalospora* – Previously named *Xerula megalospora*

*Irpex lacteus* – Milk Tooth

*Lactarius volemus* – Milk Cap

*Microstoma floccosum* – Fairy Goblets

*Mycena subcaerulea* – grey

*Neolentinus lepideus* – Train Wrecker

*Phellinus gilvus* – Tiger Eye Polypore with orange trama/flesh

*Polyporus alveolaris* – Hickory Stick Polypore (orange with hexagonal pores)

*Polyporus varius* – Little Black Foot with radial fibers on pileus/cap and larger than *P. elegans*

*Russula sp.* – red cap

*Sarcoscypha occidentalis* – Little Red Cup

*Schizophyllum commune* – Split Gill

*Scutellinia scutellata* – Eyelash Cup (red, on wood)

*Stemonitus axifera* – Chocolate Tube Slim Mold

*Stereum ostrea* – Log Leaves (smooth hymenium/underside)

*Tremellodendron pallidum* – False coral

*Xylaria hypoxylon*

And a strange orange blob on a living oak tree. Whatever it was, it was very young, somewhat rubbery, and zonate in the interior.
